

**AMENDMENT TO THE COMMITTEE PRINT  
OFFERED BY MR. DEAL OF GEORGIA**

In title I, section 133(a)(2), add at the end the following new paragraphs:

1           “(43) The term ‘ceiling fan’ means a non-port-  
2           able device that is suspended from a ceiling for cir-  
3           culating air via the rotation of fan blades.

4           “(44) The term ‘ceiling fan light kit’ means  
5           equipment designed to provide light from a ceiling  
6           fan which can be—

7                   “(A) integral, such that the equipment is  
8                   attached to the ceiling fan prior to the time of  
9                   retail sale; or

10                   “(B) attachable, such that at the time of  
11                   retail sale the equipment is not physically at-  
12                   tached to the ceiling fan, but may be included  
13                   inside the ceiling fan package at the time of  
14                   sale or sold separately for subsequent attach-  
15                   ment to the fan.”.

In title I, section 133(b)(1), add at the end the following new paragraph:



1           “(13) The Secretary shall, not later than 18  
2           months after the date of enactment of this para-  
3           graph, prescribe testing requirements for ceiling fans  
4           and ceiling fan light kits.”.

          In title I, section 133(c), add at the end the fol-  
          lowing new subsection:

5           “(dd) CEILING FANS.—

6           “(1) FEATURES.—All ceiling fans manufactured  
7           on or after January 1, 2006, shall have the following  
8           features:

9                   “(A) Lighting controls operate independ-  
10                   ently from fan speed controls.

11                   “(B) Adjustable speed controls (either  
12                   more than 1 speed or variable speed).

13                   “(C) The capability of reversible fan ac-  
14                   tion, except for fans sold for industrial applica-  
15                   tions, outdoor applications, and where safety  
16                   standards would be violated by the use of the  
17                   reversible mode. The Secretary may promulgate  
18                   regulations to define in greater detail the excep-  
19                   tions provided under this subparagraph but  
20                   may not substantively expand the exceptions.

21           “(2) REVISED STANDARDS.—

22                   “(A) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any  
23                   provision of this Act, if the requirements of



1 subsections (o) and (p) are met, the Secretary  
2 may consider and prescribe energy efficiency or  
3 energy use standards for electricity used by ceil-  
4 ing fans to circulate air in a room.

5 “(B) SPECIAL CONSIDERATION.—If the  
6 Secretary sets such standards, the Secretary  
7 shall consider—

8 “(i) exempting or setting different  
9 standards for certain product classes for  
10 which the primary standards are not tech-  
11 nically feasible or economically justified;  
12 and

13 “(ii) establishing separate exempted  
14 product classes for highly decorative fans  
15 for which air movement performance is a  
16 secondary design feature.

17 “(C) APPLICATION.—Any air movement  
18 standard prescribed under this subsection shall  
19 apply to products manufactured on or after the  
20 date that is 3 years after the date of publica-  
21 tion of a final rule establishing the standard.”.

In title I, section 134(a), add at the end the fol-  
lowing new subparagraph:

22 “(G)(i) Not later than 18 months after date of enact-  
23 ment of this subparagraph, the Commission shall prescribe



1 by rule, pursuant to this section, labeling requirements for  
2 the electricity used by ceiling fans to circulate air in a  
3 room.

4 “(ii) The rule prescribed under clause (i) shall apply  
5 to products manufactured after the later of—

6 “(I) January 1, 2009; or

7 “(II) the date that is 60 days after the final  
8 rule is prescribed.”.

In title I, subtitle C, add at the end the following  
new section:

9 **SEC. 135. PREEMPTION.**

10 Section 327 of the Energy Policy and Conservation  
11 Act (42 U.S.C. 6297) is amended by adding at the end  
12 the following:

13 “(h) CEILING FANS.—Effective on January 1, 2006,  
14 this section shall apply to and supersede all State and local  
15 standards prescribed or enacted for ceiling fans and ceil-  
16 ing fan light kits.”.
